



SEARCH HOMELESS SERVICES HOMELESSNESS IN HOUSTON DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .

- Houston used to rank in the top 10 cities for homeless populations. Today, we have reduced our homeless population so drastically that we have become a model for the rest of the nation.
- Over the past 10 years, Houston's homeless service providers have collaborated in unprecedented ways to reduce our homeless population by 53%, and SEARCH has been a major contributor to this effort.
- More than 21,000 homeless individuals have been housed since 2011. For every 10,000 Houston residents, only 6 people are homeless, compared to 20 in Austin and 93 in New York City.
- Despite our progress, there is much work to be done. According to this year's annual homeless count, there are approximately 3,055 individuals experiencing homelessness in Houston on a given night.
- SEARCH pursues a mission of *providing hope, creating opportunity, and transforming* lives for thousands of men, women, and children experiencing homelessness in our community. SEARCH brings this mission to life every day by helping our clients obtain permanent housing, increase their income, improve their health, build community, and regain stable, self-sufficient lives.
- SEARCH's work is carried out through intense, individualized case management and supportive services that help our clients every step of the way from the streets back into housing, work, and independence. We are working to make homelessness in Houston *rare, brief, and nonrecurring*.
- SEARCH also serves the youngest victims of homelessness at the House of Tiny Treasures, a nationally accredited preschool for children whose families are or have been homeless. While the children are being prepared to succeed in school and beyond, their parents can go back to school or work and take the steps they need to get their lives back on track.
- Last year, SEARCH helped more than 3,100 individuals who were homeless. We invite you to join with us and to be part of the solution as we strive for our vision of a Houston without homelessness.
